

## Rules and Expectations

All volunteers must fill out a liability waiver available online at [www.recycleannarbor.org](http://www.recycleannarbor.org), or on-site when they arrive.

**All volunteers must be over 18.**

Safety wear (provided) and closed-toe shoes must be worn at all times.

Recycle Ann Arbor has the right to refuse any individual community service volunteers if their behavior is considered dangerous or detrimental to the organization or individuals on-site.

## What should I bring?

Volunteers should bring with them a refillable water bottle and lunch if needed. They should wear clothes suitable for working outdoors.

## Zero Waste Special Events

### Volunteering

The goal at a Zero Waste event is to plan ahead to limit the amount of waste produced, by maximizing reusable products and only distributing materials that are locally recyclable or compostable (no materials that have to be land filled).

During the event, volunteers will be stationed at the three-bin Zero Waste stations to **educate patrons and assist them in sorting waste** into the correct receptacles for compost, recyclables, or trash.

**Annual events include:** The Earth Day Festival, Mayor's Green Fair, and HomeGrown Festival.

## About Recycle Ann Arbor

Recycle Ann Arbor is a 501(c)3 Non-Profit organization dedicated to the community and the environment.

**We offer a range of services which aim to divert materials from landfill and improve the environment of local communities.**

**Volunteer Community Service hours can be completed at two sites; the Drop-Off Station and the ReUse Center.**

Volunteers can complete hours at just one, or both, locations.

Additionally, volunteers can help with **Zero Waste Special Events** held throughout the year at City festivals.

**The Drop-Off Station** gives residents of Washtenaw County access to recycling services for both regular household recycling, and harder to recycle items, such as Freon appliances, and tires.

**The ReUse Center** is a donation based retail (thrift) store specializing in a range of household goods and appliances.



Recycle Ann Arbor's Drop-Off Station (DOS) is located at 2950 E. Ellsworth Rd. Ann Arbor, MI 48108.

The site is open Tuesday and Thursday, 8:30am - 6:30pm; and Saturday 9am - 6pm.

Tasks at the DOS may include: assisting customers with the unloading and placement of recyclables, sorting materials, and clearing and organizing both indoors and out.



When you arrive on site you will be given safety wear. You MUST wear closed-toe shoes at all times.

Recycle Ann Arbor's ReUse Center is located at 2420 S. Industrial Hwy. Ann Arbor, MI 48104.

The store is open Monday-Friday, 10am - 6pm; Sat 10am-5pm; and Sunday 11am - 3pm.

Service hours conducted at the ReUse Center may include: assisting with the unloading of donations, sorting and stocking materials, clearing and organizing stock both indoors and outdoors, and assisting customers in store.

All workers MUST wear closed-toe shoes.
